



Figure 2: The Reason Network of Respondent AW

Fig. 4: Reason Network BN Plus Selected Additional Components







Fig. 5: Epistemic Networks for High and Low Supporters of Ocasio-Cortez







The conversation can be modeled as one jointly-produced network














Figure 1. The Modern Paradigm




Figure 2. Postmodern Paradigm
